The word says what it means. To fear, to be afraid of getting God against you, or being at odds with God without loving his word. Fear of displeasing him in any way whatsoever.

And the worst way – primary worst way that is to have high thoughts about yourself that is called pride, and it's called arrogance and conceit and to be wise in oneself. Something that you think, you delude yourself with that is not true. It's the exact opposite of what is true.

Paul wrote that by the grace of God I am what I am. Yes, that's exactly the same as because of a lack of God's grace I am no more than what I am, unfortunately. It hasn't come to more than what it has because of a lack of God's grace and God gives grace to the humble and therefore a lack of humility. We can all take that to heart.

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Keep Yourselves from Idols //1John 5:21

In Chapter 2, verse 15 we find an apt description of what idols are, generally speaking: the things of this world! This is in harmony with the apostle Paul's explanation: "Covetousness, which is idolatry"!

In other words, the things which one covets to possess, receive, purchase, etc., are idols. In Philippians 3:18-19 we also have an explanation of this idolatry which is extremely serious: "Whose end is destruction, whose god is their belly... who set their minds on earthly things." One can both love and admire good food to such an extent that one's belly, that is, good food and much food, is one's god. Paul had often told them this, and he wept grievously over it. V. 18. This is in harmony with what he writes in Romans 1:25: "[They] worshiped the creature rather than the Creator...." For this very reason it is impossible to love money and God at the same time!!!

The great prophet Isaiah also spoke seriously about this matter in Isaiah 2:21-22 and 3:16-24. "But the idols He shall utterly abolish." Ch. 2:18.
